

YOUNG EUROPEAN TALENT PITCH THEIR ANIMATED PROJECTS AT CARTOON SPRINGBOARD MADRID

Cartoon Springboard, the pitching event aimed at young animation talent, announced the selected projects for its eleventh edition, to be held in Madrid from October 28 to 30. A training initiative for students and recent graduates from animation schools across Europe, the event combines project presentations with a program of lectures, masterclasses and panels led by renowned professionals from the animation industry. For the fourth year in a row, Cartoon Springboard is being held in Madrid, highlighting both the City and the Region importance in promoting the future of European animation.

Representing eleven countries, the 22 selected projects are mostly in their early stages of development. During the event, the talents will receive practical advice and guidance from a panel of experts which will help them further develop their projects. Chosen from a record high of 85 submissions - a substantial 47% increase over last year -, the selection includes both feature film and animated series projects.

With six projects, France tops this year's line-up, followed by Spain with four, Italy with three, and Germany with two. Greece, Hungary, Ireland, the Netherlands, Poland, Slovakia, and Ukraine are each represented with one project.

Format-wise, TV series are clearly in the majority with 18 works in a selection that also includes four feature films. Almost half of the projects are aimed at teenagers and adult audiences (10 projects), while content for children aged 6-11, family audiences, and preschoolers are represented by 5, 4, and 3 projects, respectively.

The projects from the host country are led by students or recent graduates from educational institutions based in Madrid (Lightbox, Trazos, and U-Tad), while those from France are from Atelier de Sèvres, ECV Bordeaux, Gobelins, L'Atelier, and Université de Strasbourg. The line-up also includes works by students or former students at Italy's Fondazione Bottega Finzioni and Scuola Internazionale di Comics, Germany's Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg, Greece's University of West Attica, Ireland's Limerick School of Art and Design, Hungary's Moholy-Nagy University of Art and Design, the Netherlands' St. Joost School of Art & Design, Slovakia's The Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava. Two projects in the line-up are signed by European alumni

from non-European school (National Film and Television School in the UK, and Vancouver Institute of Media Arts in Canada).

Organised by CARTOON, Cartoon Springboard is co-funded by **Creative Europe – MEDIA** with the support of the **Community of Madrid** and the **City Council of Madrid**. Out of the 258 animated works submitted to Cartoon Springboard since its first edition in 2015, 18 have been completed and more than 90 are currently in development stage.

Connecting with the future

The **Community of Madrid** is home to 35% of the animation and VFX companies in Spain. Through its Culture, Tourism and Sport Regional Office, Madrid's Community Government supports the development and production of animated series, short and feature films through different initiatives. The **Madrid City Council** is also actively involved in the region's animation industry.

Both the Community and the City Council support the four projects by graduates from Madrid educational institutions: "A Post Apocalyptic Future Where...", "Almond Eyes", "Flor" and "MÜMU™, Forget-me-not".

Four of the projects were selected directly for Cartoon Springboard in the frame of collaborations: "Where is my Fucking Horn?" (AFCA - Festival d'Animation de Rennes - France), "Puntino" (Cartoons on the Bay – Italy, "Fished & Found" (Animation Dingle - Ireland) and "Thundertree" (Magelis, Creative industries hub in Angoulême - France), while "Off Track" and "The Ageless Summer" takes part in the event supported by France's SACD - Société des Auteurs et Compositeurs Dramatiques.

Seven of the selected projects already have a production company partner on board for their development or production, including Spain's The Milk and TrendPicStudio, France's Werlen Ipsum and Disnosc, Germany's PixelPEC, Ireland's JAM Media, and Slovakia's NAOCHO Production.

With the aim of connecting the young talent attending the event with the local animation industry, on the morning of October 28, Cartoon Springboard will host a <u>Job Fair</u> in which local studios will introduce their work, including the job opportunities they offer; a networking session between the young talent and company representatives will follow. For the first time, <u>One-to-One meetings</u> will be organised on Wednesday 29 October evening to connect young talents with professionals during individual sessions.

Together with the pitching sessions, Cartoon Springboard's <u>programme</u> features the following key notes: "Dive Into the Deep: Building Worlds Beyond Animation", in which **Reza Memari (Telescope Animation)** will reveal the secrets of launching transmedia IPs in today's media landscape; "High Expectations, Hard Times: How to survive in the animation industry these days when you're a young creative?" by **Joanne Allen (BBC)**, and "Navigating the Internet's many platforms and making a living from social media, how does it work?" **by Meï Champeil.**

In addition, renowned Spanish director **Sergio Pablos** will be presenting the sneak preview of "Ember", his long awaited film project by SPA Studios, while **Mark Cumberton (JAM Media)**, **Miklos Weigert**, **Eliza Plocieniak-Alvarez (Blaue Pampelmuse)**, **Barbara Slade (Blue Arrow Productions)** and **Alba Sotorra Clua (Alba Sotorra)** will reflect on the challenges of using A.I. tools in animation in the panel "Made by Humans, Made with A.I."

Among the experts and speakers participating in the Cartoon Springboard, which features Agnès Bizzaro as Head of Content, are representatives of TV channels such as Marianne Lévy-Leblond (ARTE France), Joanne Allen (BBC), Lucile Canault (France Télévisions - FTV), Yago Fandiño (Radio Television Española - RTVE), Sara Cabras (RAI Ragazzi / Radiotelevisione Italiana - RAI), and Lisa Albers (Super RTL Fernsehen), and producers such as Juraj Krasnohorsky (Artichoke), Gabrielle d'Andrimont (Bobbypills), David Mouraire (Doghouse Films), João Carrilho (Fly Moustache), Tom van Waveren (Hoek, Line & Thinker), Jakub Karwowski (Letko), Edward Moline (Lighthouse Studios), Ivan Agenjo (Peekaboo Animation), Valeria Brambilla (Studio Campedelli), Viviane Vanfleteren (Vivi Film), and David Sauerwein (Zephyr Animation), among others.
